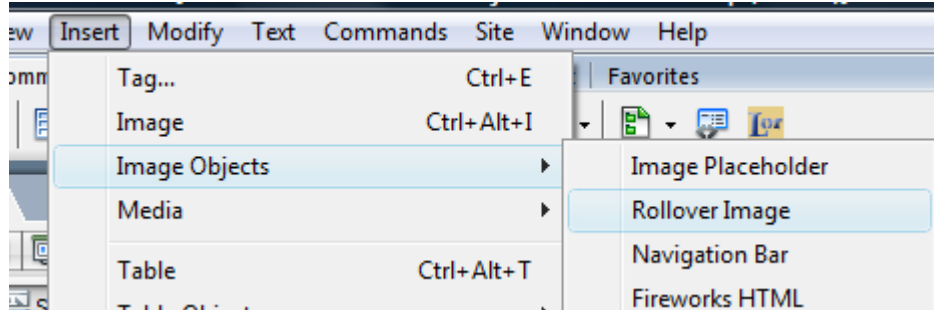
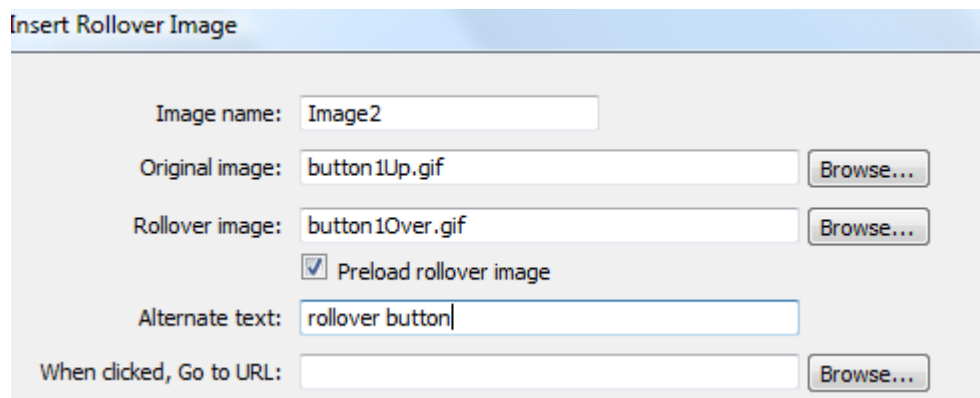


JAVASCRIPT ROLLOVERS

1. Launch Dreamweaver, create or import your site definition, and create a new folder named **practiceRollover**. Create 2 new pages within the folder. (**rollover.html, cssrollover.html**)
2. In Photoshop, create a button image (rounded rectangle with text). Save for the Web to export (**button1Up.gif**). Change the button colors and export a second image (**button1Over.gif**). (NOTE - you can change other things, but make sure both images have the same dimensions). Move these files into your Dreamweaver **practiceRollover** folder.
3. Now, hide the text layer and export again (**button1bgUp.gif, button1bgOver.gif**)
4. Open **rollover.html**. Create a Javascript Rollover button by selecting **Insert > Image Objects > Rollover Image**.



Browse to your up and over button files and click **OK**.



5. Use F12 to test your rollover.

CSS ROLLOVERS

1. Launch <http://css.maxdesign.com.au/listamatic/> and choose a vertical or horizontal list navigation scheme that you like. Choose an example with rollover effects like **ProjectSeven's Uberlist** or **A List Apart's Taming lists**.
2. Open **cssrollover.html** in Dreamweaver. Use Page Properties to set the background color and font face. Copy and paste the **listamatic** HTML section within the body of the code. Copy and paste the **listamatic** CSS section within the style tag of the code. Save and use F12 to test.
3. Add a new button. (Just use enter key after an existing link, enter some text, and make sure there is something in the link box of the property inspector.)
4. Use the CSS Panel to adjust colors and sizes. Try adding a background image for the link and hover rules.
5. What are the advantages of CSS Rollovers?
